Highway A65, Langon/Pau, the first highway since the Grenelle Environment agreement designed and built with safekeeping water resources as a guiding principle.

Runoff management on the highway

Chronic pollution:
Caused by rainwater runoff from highways, it is a persistent discharge of polluting substances that negatively impact the surrounding natural environment.

Managing the runoff toward natural basins

A'LIENOR is obliged to be totally **transparent** about natural flows, and at each low point of the natural terrain it has installed large-size crossing structures.
